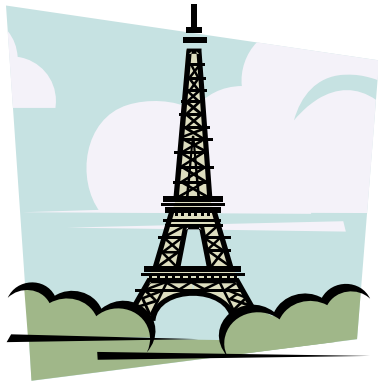


I don't want to relocate!
